Alan Lacer has been involved in the turning field for over thirty years as a turner, teacher, writer, exhibition coordinator, demonstrator and past president of the American Association of Woodturners. His work has appeared in a number of regional and national shows exhibitions. Alan has been a regular instructor and demonstrator of the craft – having worked in over 45 states and 4 foreign countries. His writings have covered technical aspects of woodturning, many specific projects, stories related to both contemporary and historical woodturning and the long turning traditions of Japan and Germany. He has also produced three videos on his own, with two of them winning a total of four national awards. In 1999 the American Association of Woodturners awarded him their Lifetime Honorary Member Award for his contributions to the field.

Sam Angelo

Sam Angelo has been turning since 1988. He turns every day. He has also worked as a teacher (starting in Miles City), now a school counselor at Worland Middle School, for a total of 35 years in education.

Sam has done a number of adult woodworking classes in Worland and spent a lot of time in the school's shop giving lathe demo's and helping kids. He has spent 25 years in Worland restoring antiques and building furniture and custom cabinets. His main focus now is maintaining his website (www.wyomingwoodturner.com) and keeping it supplied with bowls and other turnings.

He has written two articles for Woodturning Design magazine, one of which is out in the Fall, 2008 issue.

Sam specializes in drying wood – from the tree to finished bowl, wood movement – implications for bowl turning, chucking methods – rough turning and finishing on the lathe.
